WHY?

Floods are increasing in frequency and intensity across the Hudson Valley.

Extreme rain and massive storms are impacting communities throughout the Hudson Valley, while rising seas are contribute to high tide flooding and storm surge along the Hudson River waterfront.



WHO?

Local governments bear the primary responsibility for local flood resilience planning, but many have limited capacity, funding, and support to advance this critical work.

The FRN includes local governments as *Members*, along with regional *Partners*.



HOW?

The FRN helps municipal governments access resources and navigate complex processes, while providing a platform for peer learning and support.

The FRN provides regular programs focused on priority issues, including tours of projects, in-person meetings, and webinars.
